



Al Madad Foundation Gift Acceptance Policy

Gift Acceptance

Acceptance of any contribution, gift or grant is at the absolute discretion of Al Madad Foundation (AMF).

All programmes, trust agreements, contracts, or commitments will first consider the individual needs of the donor, and secondly, AMF. A charitable gift that benefits AMF at the expense of the donor's interest will not be encouraged.

AMF accepts unrestricted gifts and donations for specific programmes and purposes, provided that such gifts are not inconsistent with its stated mission, purposes, and priorities.

AMF encourages donors to seek guidance from their own professional advisors to assist them in the process of making their gift. AMF cannot give accounting, tax, or legal advice but will work closely with the donor's advisors.

AMF accepts donations of cash or publicly traded securities, with gifts of in-kind services accepted on a case by case basis.

Certain other gifts, real property, personal property, in-kind gifts, non-liquid securities, and contributions whose sources are not transparent or whose use is restricted in some manner must be reviewed prior to acceptance.

Gift Solicitation

All decisions to solicit and/or accept potentially controversial gifts will be made by the Board in consultation with the Managing Director. The primary consideration will always be the impact of the gift on the organisation.

AMF will not compensate, whether through commissions, finders' fees, or other means, any third party for directing a gift or a donor to AMF.

Donor Information



AMF will respect the intent of the donor relating to gifts for restricted purposes and to the desire to remain anonymous. With anonymous gifts, AMF will limit access to donor information to selected staff members with a legitimate need to be informed.

All information concerning donors or prospective donors, including their names, the names of their beneficiaries, the exact amount of the gift, size of the estate, or any other information for which there is a reasonable expectation of privacy and/or confidentiality is kept strictly confidential unless written permission is obtained from the donor to release such information, or it is required by law.

Gift Refusal

Gifts may be declined under certain conditions including, but not limited to:

- The gift is restricted and requires support from other resources that are unavailable, inadequate, or may be needed for other institutional purposes
- The gift is restricted and supports a purpose or programme peripheral to the existing principal purposes of AMF, or dissipates resources or deflects energies from other AMF programmes or purposes
- The gift injures the reputation or standing of AMF or generates such controversy as to substantially frustrate and defeat the purpose to be served
- The source of the gift cannot be adequately verified
- Acceptance of the gift would be, whether directly or indirectly, detrimental to another individual, body or organisation
- The gift stems from a source considered by AMF to be unethical or in direct conflict with our stated mission and beliefs
